


WHAT WE STRIVE FOR

THE CAUSE

With climate impacts on the rise and only 3% of charitable giving going toward environmental nonprofits,
Climate Ride is filling the gap between the challenges of climate change and the funds needed for organizations leading the fight. We need a variety of solutions. Our goal is to empower more people to take action and fund the movement.

FACING THE CHALLENGES

Climate Ride presents an opportunity for people to be bold and reset their limits. Riding hundreds of miles, hiking in vast wilderness - people learn they have what it takes to meet the bigger challenges facing our planet.

Participants often report fundraising more than they imagined they could.

Their passion for the Climate Ride cause becomes infectious, and inspires

people to give and to act.





OUR IMPACT

Raising funds for organizations that are making the difference for our planet is what we do best.

GRANTS

Climate Ride empowers new fundraisers to step up their game. We offer coaching on how to support our beneficiary partners, creating citizen philanthropists. In 2023, their outreach resulted in grants to 239 nonprofits.

ADVOCACY

We bring together people from all 50 states and around the globe to ride, hike, and run with us. Participants carry a message of climate action as they fundraise, reaching out to over 100 supporters on average. After participating in an event, people report they are more likely to take action on climate change.

OUTREACH

Whether they ride hundreds of miles along the California coast or run in the deep wilderness beside the Rogue River, our participants take on challenges that let them talk to friends and family about protecting our planet. We give a platform to your voice.

MOVEMENT

Since 2008, Climate Riders have engaged more than 173,500 people to join them to support this cause. Every donation is more than just money — it's also a moment of connection about climate change. Many donors go on to become Climate Riders.







OUR EVENTS

Climate Ride creates charitable cycling, hiking, running, and virtual events that give participants the unique opportunity to merge environmental passion with getting outside.

EDUCATE AND INSPIRE

Climate Ride empowers participants to engage in the fight for our planet by completing multi-day cycling, hiking, and running events while fundraising for the organizations who are turning our values into a sustainable reality. On each event, participants get the opportunity to meet and learn from remarkable people who work on sustainability, clean energy, climate change solutions, and active transportation, exchanging ideas and making meaningful connections.

BUILD COMMUNITY

Our events bring together diverse communities of folks who love our planet and turn strangers into family during the challenges and triumphs of each trip. Year after year, Climate Ride participants return to explore new routes, raise more funds, and deepen their resolve to change our communities and our world for the better. ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE ACTION GRANTS

In 2021, Climate Ride created an action grants program to support organizations fighting systemic racism, expanding access to the outdoors for underserved communities, and making progress on environmental and social justice. So far we've granted \$120,000 and we're nowhere near hitting the brakes!

In 2023, we granted a total of \$40,000 through eight \$5K grants.

GRANTS IN ACTION

In 2023, 754 Climate Riders, Runners, Risers, and Hikers enabled us to award over \$2.5 million in grants. This brings our total impact to over \$13 million since 2008.

Our independent efforts to generate powerful grants have resulted in direct support to help fight legal battles for public lands and clean air. We've amplified diverse voices in sustainable transportation and provided funds for organizations building safer options for bicyclists and walkers. Our grants have led to renewable energy projects in national parks, relieving pollution in critically impacted ecosystems.

Together we've braced an environmental movement that needs new voices and an active citizenry willing to walk the walk and bike the bike.

We delivered 239 grants to Beneficiaries working in sustainability, renewable energy, climate action, conservation, and public health.

WILD TOMORROW TOTAL CLIMATE RIDE GRANT: \$387,320

Activities

Saving Wild Spaces | Wild Tomorrow is working to protect, restore and re-wild a critically important wildlife corridor in KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa.

Helping Communities | Everyone must benefit from conserving wild spaces. This includes the people living in the poor rural communities that surround their protected areas.

Saving Wildlife | Helping wild animals in Southern Africa by creating wildlife corridors and providing supplies on the ground, supporting in-field conservation and research.

Successes

- To date they have secured over 3,200 acres of land that was at risk from development.
- Providing employment, training and education to surrounding communities. Training local women green skills and supporting them in creating businesses. Building a local school.
- Supporting scientists researching in areas of high biodiversity and endangered species.

GLACIER CONSERVANCY TOTAL CLIMATE RIDE GRANT: \$748,107

Activities

Preservation | The Conservancy funds projects and programs that preserve Glacier's heritage for future generations.

Education | The Conservancy funds education initiatives to engage current and future park stewards of all ages.

Research | The Conservancy supports world-class research and science exploring the park's wildlife and alpine landscapes.

Successes

- Making the Apgar Visitor Center net zero by installing solar panels.
- Running a Spring Hiker-Biker Shuttle on the west side of the Going-to-the-Sun road to reduce congestion from cars.
- Surveying wildlife populations in the park such as lynx, golden eagles, and the reintroduction of bison to the park.

RICH CITY RIDES TOTAL CLIMATE RIDE GRANT: \$15,631

Activities

Bike Programming | Community Strava Club, Community Care Social Rides, Youth Bike Club, Bike Repair Workshops, Commuter Cyclist Program and more.

Everybody Rides Program | Provides refurbished bikes by request at no cost.

Successes

- Has gifted 3,269+ bikes to kids and adults in need.
- Engaged 32,901+ participants through family friendly activities and events.
- Held 800+ Bike Repair Workshops serving community members and rescuing bikes to redirect them back into the community.
- Offered a range of 1,401+ activities including bike rides, cleanups, hikes, and camping trips.

THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY TOTAL CLIMATE RIDE GRANT: \$82,576

Activities

Climate Advocacy | ACE advocates for a world beyond fossil fuels—a world in which our leaders tell the truth, acknowledge the climate emergency, and act at an emergency-level speed to stop it.

Action Team Network | While elected leaders bury their heads in the sand, ACE is organizing, building power, and demanding solutions that meet the scale of the problem. ACE Action Teams across the U.S. work together to create a powerful force to demand that our leaders act on the climate emergency right now.

Successes

- Running several campaigns to rally youth to take local and national action including: calling on local governments to declare a climate emergency, petitioning JP Morgan Chase to stop funding fossil fuels, stopping the Willow Project, and more.
- Registered more than 100,000 new youth voters across the US, with special emphasis in key electoral states.

TOTAL CLIMATE RIDE GRANT: \$347,008

Activities

Online Campaigns | 350.org distributes online resources to encourage people to: 1) keep carbon in the ground; 2) help build a new, more equitable low-carbon economy; and 3) pressure governments into limiting emissions.

Grassroots Organizing | 350.org has created local groups around the globe in over 188 countries who work in coordination with one another to create demonstrations and international days of action.

Successes

- Rallying thousands of people to stop one of Germany's largest coal mines for a day.
- Shifting the conversation on climate change in the United States to divestment, clean energy subsidies, and alternative solutions become centered.
- Organizing the People's Climate Match which brought together 200,000 people and created 7.6 million social media impressions.


